NY/2009/0176/FUL – 86 MARSTON BUSINESS PARK, TOCKWITH

Please register our objection to the proposed Waste Incinerator Plant on Marston Business Park, Tockwith. As an owner of a distribution business on the site, including warehouse, offices, meeting room and demonstration and training facilities, we feel that such a proposal will be detrimental for a number of reasons.

Staff and visitor safety would be our first concern, we would be unhappy with spending our working day breathing in the emissions from the plant which, despite being told are safe levels of poisons, we feel that there is no such thing as a safe level of mercury, nickel, lead and dioxins. The road infrastructure leading to the Business Park is not at all suited for a large number of extra HGV vehicles, nor would we wish to be put in any danger should anything at the plant go wrong and toxins be released into the atmosphere.

When first taking our units at the Business Park, we chose for the rural, peaceful location and because it was not industrial. The very placing of such a plant here would completely change the area, and we would have to consider relocating. We do not wish to have our staff, or visitors subjected to the sight, sound, smell or emissions from this proposed incinerator.

Please ensure our full and complete objection to this planning application are taken into account.
